1.	BID SUBMISSION:
1.1.	Bids must be delivered by the stipulated time to the correct address. Late bids will not be accepted for consideration.
	All bids must be submitted on the official forms provided— (not to be re-typed) or online
1.3.	This bid is subject to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 2000 and the Preferential Procurement Regulations. 2017. and. if applicable. any other legislation or Special Requirement of the Contract.
2.	TAX COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS
	Bidders must ensure compliance with their tax obligations.
2.2	Application for tax compliance status (tcs) pin may be made via e-filing through the sars website www.sars.gov.za.
2.3	In bids where consortia / joint ventures / sub-contractors are involved. each party must submit a separate tcs certificate / pin / csd number.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT OF QUOTATION:

1. CONTRACT PERIOD:

- 1.1 This is a five year contract for the appointment of a service provider to provide off-site records storage, back up media, disposal services, scanning/digitization, uploading of files to the software application and retrieval of documents on as and when required for a period of five (05) years.
- 1.2 SANC reserves the right to extend or cancel the contract, pending available funding and satisfaction with service delivery.

2. ACCEPTABLE BIDS/OFFERS:

- 2.1 The SANC reserves the right to cancel or withdraw the bid without prior notification.
- 2.2 SANC is not obliged to award the quotation to the lowest bidder.
- 2.3 The SANC may request interviews/presentations/pitching sessions with shortlisted bidders before the final selection is made.
- 2.4 The SANC will not be liable for any cost incurred by a service provider in the process of responding to this bid. including on-site presentations and the preparation of the proposal.
- 2.5 The SANC will not consider any late bids. All bids submitted after the stipulated closing date and time will not be considered and it will be sent back to the bidder unopened.
- **2.6** Any effort by the bidder to influence bid evaluation, bid comparisons or bid award decisions in any manner, may result in rejection of the bid concerned.
- 2.7 The successful bidder will be informed in writing of the intent to award or per an official order.
- 2.8 The bid has a validity period of 120 days from date of closure of the bid/tender.
- 2.9 No bid may be awarded to a person who has failed to submit proof of his/her tax compliance status (tax clearance certificate and personal identification number issued by SARS) or any proof certifying that the taxes of that person is in order or that suitable arrangements have been made with SARS.
- **2.10** Where it is discovered that an advantaged company used a disadvantaged person, as a "front" to acquire a Bid, such company will be disqualified and the Bid shall be withdrawn.
- **2.11** Only bids complying with all requirements as stipulated in the Terms of Reference/Scope of Work/Specification will be regarded as acceptable.
- 2.12 The following qualifying criteria must be strictly adhered to and bidders should attach the following documents. Non-compliance to these criteria may invalidate your bid:

- 2.13 Please take note that, should the bidder/tenderer fail to comply with the above matter their offer will be regarded as non-responsive.

3. SUBMISSION OF BIDS:

- 3.1 Bidders will be required to submit their bids/proposals via email or hand delivered as stipulated below:
- 3.1.1 Tenderers are required to submit a Completed bid pack (this documents). including:
 - a) Duly completed and signed RFQ documents
 - b) B-BBEE certificate or Sworn Affidavit.
 - c) Copy of its last three (3) years' audited or reviewed annual financial statements
 - d) Proof of CSD registration report

- 3.2 Any bidder who fails to comply with any requirement of the bid may, at the discretion of the Bid Evaluation Committee, be regarded as non-compliant and as a result be rejected.

4. PAYMENTS:

- 4.1 SANC undertakes to pay delivery validated invoices in full within thirty (30) days from the invoice date or upon agreed payment intervals as accepted in the contract. All invoices should be sent to the following email address: sancinvoices@sanc.co.za.
- 4.2 No invoices for outstanding deliverables or for any unproductive or duplicated time spent by the service provider will be validated for payment.
- 4.3 Invoices should be emailed or hand -delivered to SANC timeously.
- 4.4 The invoices should be original and must be accompanied by an inspection certificate and/or proof of delivery.

5. SUPPLY / DELIVERY VALIDATION:

5.1 The certificate and the related report of delivery/installation/ progress milestone/commissioning will be validated by a SANC representative prior to payment of final invoices.

6. VALUE ADDED TAX:

6.1 All contract prices are inclusive of 15% value added Tax (VAT). except in the case of a person that is not required to register for Value Added Tax. Companies not registered in terms of Value Added Tax. may not claim VAT on invoices.

7. PRICE AND PRICE QUALIFICATION:

- 7.1 Prices for the first year are firm.
- 7.2 All prices shall be quoted in the South African currency (ZAR).
- 7.3 The bid prices shall be given in the units shown and will be awarded as a whole not per item.
- 7.4 Prices must be inclusive of delivery costs and all taxes.
- 7.5 Please note that the foreign exchange risk in case of imported goods and service is for the account of the bidder.
- 7.6 Please indicate the % escalation where required for the next four (4) years.
- 7.7 No changes or extensions or additional ad hoc costs are accepted once the contract has been awarded and/or signed.

8. COMMUNICATION:

- 8.1 Communication will only be restricted to Supply Chain Management Officials.
- 8.2 The South African Nursing Council may request clarification in writing regarding the information provided by bidders. Bidders are to supply the required information within the specified period. Failing to do so may invalidate your bid.

9. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

- 9.1 All the information contained in this document is intended solely for the purpose of assisting bidders to prepare their bids. Any use of the information contained herein for another purpose than those stated in this document is prohibited.
- 9.2 The ownership and intellectual property rights of all designs, specifications, programming code and all other documentation provided by the SANC to the bidder/tenderer, both successful and unsuccessful, remain the property of the SANC.

10. SUPPLIER DUE DILIGENCE:

- 10.1 The SANC may conduct due diligence to all shortlisted bidders/tenderers to identify their specific capabilities and financial stability.
- 10.2 The SANC may visit the premises of the bidders or those of their suppliers.
- 10.3 Some of the key elements that should be documented and included during the comprehensive supplier analysis/due diligence include: the current workload of the supplier, cost structure of the tender/bid, the financial status of the bidder/tenderer, the previous customer satisfaction levels, the support capabilities, their relative strength, weaknesses and core capabilities, how SANC fits into the tenderers/bidders business and how the tenderer/bidder is viewed by the public, etc.
- 10.4 Bidders may be required to provide names of traceable references who may also be visited to confirm their testimonials.

11. DISPUTES

11.1 The relevant bidder agrees that should any dispute arise from the contract, the matter shall be submitted to the relevant Bid Adjudication Committee for a ruling and such ruling shall be final

TERMS OF REFERENCES

APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO PROVIDE OFF-SITE RECORDS STORAGE, BACK UP MEDIA, DISPOSAL SERVICES, SCANNING/DIGITIZATION, UPLOADING OF FILES TO THE SOFTWARE APPLICATION AND RETRIEVAL OF DOCUMENTS ON AS AND WHEN REQUIRED FOR A PERIOD OF FIVE (05) YEARS

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this document is to invite suitably qualified. capacitated and experienced service providers. who are NARSSA accredited and who can provide all of the services as stipulated in requirement one and two. to submit quotations for:

1.1. Requirement One:

1.1.1.The storage. inventory management. provision of document retrieval services. storage and retrieval of back up media devices. provision of document storage containers. provision of an on-line user accessible document and back up media storage management administration solution. provision of archiving and management/disposal service for stored documents and back up media for a five (05) year period.

1.2. Requirement Two:

1.2.1. The imaging. categorisation and uploading of documentation on to the Canon Therefore software application as deployed at the South African Nursing Council as a once-off initiative.

2. THE SANC INTERNAL ENVIRONMENT

- 2.1. ICT Infrastructure:
 - 2.1.1.Standardised on Microsoft Server 2019;
 - 2.1.2.Databases standardised on SQL 2019;
 - 2.1.3.End-User equipment Windows 10;
 - 2.1.4.Data backup solution VEEAM backup solution;
 - 2.1.5. Canon Therefore document management software; and
 - 2.1.6.WAN connectivity 150 Mbps link.

3. REQUIREMENTS - REQUIREMENT ONE

The SANC is looking to. at its complete discretion, enter into an agreement with a bidder who is able to **fully comply** with the following requirements:

- 3.1. The Bidder must have at least five years of related experience of having performed work of an exact same nature and comparable volume to at least 5 other clients utilising proven and established processes. procedures. tools and software/systems.
- 3.2. The Bidder must be situated within an 80 kilometre radius from the SANC premises and should have the physical facilities. capacity. capability and experience that is required.
- 3.3. Be able to store at least six thousand (6 000) to ten thousand (10 000) document storage boxes which will contain approximately two thousand two hundred (2 200) A4 pages each. The approximate size of the boxes is estimated to be:
 - 3.3.1.H 250 mm
 - 3.3.2.L 430 mm
 - 3.3.3.W 325 mm
- 3.4. Be able to store at least twenty (20) to sixty (60) back up media devices i.e. LT07 or equivalent tapes.

- 3.5. The bidder must be able to:
 - 3.5.1. Provide the required boxes and lids used for storage of documents as per paragraph 3.3 above.
 - 3.5.1.1. This will be applicable to all additional storage requirements as the initial take-on of storage boxes is estimated to be approximately 6200 pre-packed boxes.
- 3.6. Each storage box is to be represented/managed in an on-line application to which the SANC nominated staff will have access to and the on-line application must be able to:
 - 3.6.1. Have a unique record of existence for each box i.e. box number reflected on scanner bar code sticker attached to the storage box.
 - 3.6.2.List the unique document inventory per storage box (reflecting the content of the documents in the storage box) and attach/insert a hard copy of such inventory list to/within the storage box).
 - 3.6.2.1. Electronically capture the storage box content/inventory to the on-line document management solution for visibility by the SANC based upon a 5 meta data record per recordable inventory item provided by the SANC making use of a WAN or 3G/4G or related remote connection prior to the additional inventory leaving the SANC premises.
 - 3.6.2.2. Provide a copy of the printed storage box inventory list which is to signed off and dated by the nominated SANC representative.

3.6.3. Record the related date(s):

- 3.6.3.1. On which a storage box was taken into inventory at the bidder premises.
- 3.6.3.2. Any subsequent dates that it was retrieved by the SANC.
- 3.6.3.3. The date on which the storage box was subsequently returned to storage by the SANC.
- 3.6.3.4. The date that the returned storage box inventory was confirmed as being unchanged.
- 3.6.3.5. The SANC was informed of any missing documents as per the original inventory for storage boxes returned by the SANC.
 - 3.6.3.5.1. The date on which the storage box inventory was either corrected by the SANC or the date and associated instructions by the SANC to alter the inventory list associated with the storage box.

3.7. Be able to deliver to the SANC and collect from the SANC any storage boxes:

3.7.1. Within one business day after being requested to do so via the on-line portal/application.

3.8. Implement and execute a document and archival/destruction process:

- 3.8.1 In in accordance with a document policy retention policy that is to be determined by the SANC based upon the type of document or data storage device.
- 3.8.2 Provide certified proof of compliance with such a retention policy if and when executed
- 3.8.3 Update the inventory record on the on-line application data base with the relevant information.
- 3.8.4 Obtain formal confirmation from the SANC nominated representative prior to the destruction of any documentation.

3.9. Confidentiality and security of SANC documentation and other items stored:

- 3.9.1. A dedicated storage area is to be determined for the physical storage of all documents and other storage requirements of the SANC.
- 3.9.2. The dedicated storage area is to be secure and only authorised bidder staff who has signed a confidentiality declaration (content thereof to be approved by the SANC) will have access to and/or be allowed to transport such documents and other storage media and have access to the on-line application.
- 3.9.3. The bidder is to confirm that all of its document processes and procedures complies with the requirements of the Protection of Personal Information Act (POPI) and that compliance against such requirements is independently verified annually and that the results thereof will be made available to the SANC.
- 3.9.4. The premises and specifically the storage facilities are compliant with all industry requirements related to privileged access, physical security, fire, water, rodent/insect infestation and other environmental damage prevention.
- 3.9.5. The on-line application solution is to be backed up daily (preferably in real time) to an alternative Disaster Recovery (DR) site/environment and that access to information in the on-line solution/application can be restored within one business day after any DR related disaster.
- 3.9.6. An annual risk audit related to processes and procedures are to be performed by an independent third party and such unabridged outcome is to be shared with the SANC.

3.10. Reporting:

- 3.10.1. It is a requirement that the bidder be able to provide detailed reporting, both on-line and hard copy format, to the SANC and the following minimum reports are to be included:
- 3.10.1.1. Boxes/documents due for destruction.
- 3.10.1.2. Boxes/files retrieved by the sanc but not returned.
- 3.10.1.3. Boxes/files retrieved and returned.
- 3.10.1.4. Boxes/files requested for retrieval and not yet delivered to the SANC.
- 3.10.1.5. Boxes/files in storage.
- 3.10.1.6. Boxes in inventory.
- 3.10.1.7. File inventory (by box if required).
- 3.10.1.8. Take on date by file and box.
- 3.10.1.9. Retention period and dates per box and file or combination thereof.
- 3.10.1.10. Historical destruction information (boxes and files).
- 3.10.1.11. Audit trails for any updates/changes made to any information related to the sanc information being stored/managed by the bidder.

3.11. The bidder must provide a detailed approach for the performance of all work associated with the bid and must, but not necessarily be limited to, include the following:

- 3.11.1. Document collection and transport process.
- 3.11.2. Storage and document control at bidder premises.
- 3.11.3. Document/back up media storage take-on process
- 3.11.4. Document/back up media retrieval and collection process
- 3.11.5. Reporting process and capabilities.
- 3.11.6. Document/back up media retrieved return and transport process.
- 3.11.7. Billing and quality assurance process.
- 3.11.8. Bidder BCP policy, and
- 3.11.9. Bidder site access and security policy.

3.12. Insurance:

3.12.1. The bidder is to provide the SANC with a detailed overview of the third party liability and damages insurance that it provides on behalf of its clients.

4. REQUIREMENTS - REQUIREMENT TWO

- 4.1. The Bidder must have at least five years of related experience of having performed work of an exact same nature and comparable volume to at least 5 other clients utilising proven and established processes. procedures. tools and software/systems.
- 4.2. The Bidder must be situated within an eighty (80) kilometres radius from the SANC premises and should have the physical facilities. capacity. capability and experience that is required.
- 4.3. The SANC is looking to. at its complete discretion. enter into an agreement with a Bidder which are able to comply with the following requirements:
 - 4.3.1 Scan and digitise a minimum of six (6) million. one sided. A4 size documents in a format that will ensure that the file size of the digitised document is optimised. The use of a .pdf format is proposed but the vendor may make alternative proposals as to the file format on condition that it is a mainstream file format that will be available for at least the next 10 years and that the associated image file size benefit is conclusively more effective and that the retrieval thereof from a centralised database will not require the procurement of any proprietary software nor that it will create any processing "overheads" on excess of that when using a pdf format.
- 4.4 The number of documentation to be scanned and digitised could. at the sole discretion of the SANC. be increased to a maximum of twenty (20) million documents depending on the bidder pricing and the availability of required funding.
- 4.5 Each scanned and digitised document will need to be uploaded to the Canon Therefore solution as deployed at the SANC and for each document it is a requirement that 5 meta data/indexing field information be captured. It is recommended that the bidder assume that on average that meta data/indexing field information will be required for every three (3) pages scanned and digitised. The SANC staff will provide the bidder with the required meta data for the scanned/digitised pages.
- 4.6 The bidder will be required to provide the digitised document information on a readable format and on media that will allow for the uploading thereof to the server infrastructure and SQL data base at the SANC.
- 4.7 The bidder will be required to file each scanned/digitised document in a "storage" box and that an associated index be created for the content of each storage box the indexing information will be similar to the meta data captured. The index per storage box should be in a format that allows it to be uploaded to an automated retrieval solution and must also be reflected on the inside/outside of the storage box for easy identification of the content of the storage box.
- 4.8 The SANC will only be liable for scanned/digitalized images which contains information which is relevant to the organisation and will not be liable for costs associated with scanned/digitalized documentation which reflects "marks" or "images" which is not related to actual content.
- 4.9 The indexed storage boxes are to be delivered to the SANC premises (if scanning and indexing is performed off-site).
- 4.10 The storage boxes must be compliant with the National Archives & Records Services (NARSSA) standards the SANC is currently using procured storage boxes for this purpose (W 325/ H 250/L 430) with a lid. These boxes hold an estimated 2 200 pages per box and the associated assumption is to be used by the bidder. These boxes are to be re-used by the bidder.

- 4.11 The costs associated with the provisioning of NARSSA compliant storage boxes will be included in the proposed fixed pricing as submitted by the bidder.
- 4.12 The bidder can deploy scanning and indexing software and hardware at the SANC or choose to perform such activities at its premises the bidder is to clearly indicate the approach to be used and any associated requirements that it would have for space and other facilities should it propose that the work be performed at the SANC premises.
- 4.13 All transport of documentation. to and from the SANC. will be for the account of the bidder.
- 4.14 All transport used by the bidder must ensure that any documentation in transit is adequately safeguarded against loss, theft and/or fire.
- 4.15 All documentation held at the bidder premises must be adequately safeguarded against loss. theft and/or fire.
- 4.16 The bidder will be required to conclude the initial six (6) million-page scanning/digitalisation. indexing. boxing and the provision of the upload media in the required format within a three-month period.
- 4.17 The bidder will be required to submit weekly progress reports to the SANC.
- 4.18 A register. preferably in electronic format. is to be kept of all documentation that is removed from the SANC premises and is to be updated by SANC staff once the documents are returned in a boxed and indexed format.
- 4.19 The bidder must provide a detailed approach for the performance of all work associated with the bid and must. but not necessarily be limited to. include the following:
 - 4.19.1 Document collection and transport process.
 - 4.19.2 Storage and document control at bidder premises.
 - 4.19.3 Scanning and digitisation software and tools to be used.
 - 4.19.4 Document preparation process.
 - 4.19.5 Scanning and indexing process.
 - 4.19.6 Meta data capturing process.
 - 4.19.7 Packing and labelling process.
 - 4.19.8 Media format and file format of digitised documentation.
 - 4.19.9 Reporting process.
 - 4.19.10 Document return and transport process. and
 - 4.19.11 Billing and quality assurance process.

5 REQUIREMENT ONE PRICING AND PAYMENT TERMS:

5.3 General:

- 5.3.1 The Bidder is required to agree on the following payment terms:
 - 5.3.1.1 Payment for goods and services delivered to the SANC will be made by the SANC thirty days after the receipt of an invoice complying with the South African Revenue Services requirements for such an invoice and,
 - 5.3.1.2 Bidder invoices will only be paid if supported by all relevant proof of services and goods provided.

5.4 Requirement one:

5.4.1 The Bidder will be required to:

5.4.1.1 Provide a fixed price (including VAT) for the first year of the contract period and commit to price increases thereafter for the remainder of the contract period which will not exceed the average annual CPIX for the previous twelve (12) month period per annum thereafter for services and goods. and

5.4.1.2 Agree that the SANC will not accept or be liable for any additional billing and/or charges of whatsoever nature other than the fixed price as quoted by the bidder.

5.5 Requirement two:

- 5.5.1 The Bidder will be required to:
 - 5.5.1.1 Provide a fixed price (including VAT) for the performance of the scope of work as described in Requirement Two. The fixed price is to include costs (including VAT) for all associated goods. services and other ad-hoc costs. The SANC will not accept any additional billing and/or charges of whatsoever nature other than the fixed price as quoted by the bidder.

6 REQUIREMENT ONE AND TWO REQUIREMENTS FULFILMENT:

- 6.3 Only responses from Bidders who are able to provide all of the products/goods as well as have the required maintenance and support capabilities and capacity and whose submissions comply with all of the stated requirements will be considered.
- 6.4 Only responses from NARSSA accredited bidders will be considered.

7 EVALUATION/AWARDING OF BID:

- 7.3 Evaluation method to be used:
 - 7.3.1 After the closing date. an appointed SANC bid evaluation committee will evaluate the Bids; and
